Certificate II in Rural Operations— (AHC21210)

This is a course of study that links students to the Mount Compass Farm, an intensively block grazed beef farm, hosting pasture, fertilizer and grazing trials. It can also link students to a variety of farms locally, particularly dairies through the work placement process. Many special activities run through the year that students can have contact with. These may include show programs with goats and beef cattle and sheep production. Work placement and some units of study with horses may also be available by negotiation.

Format:

1 day per week for 2 years—commences Week 2, Term 1 2018
Structured work placement will be arranged on an individual basis with students and will occur on Wednesday's. A minimum of 10 days per year of work placement must be achieved to get industry experience in each unit of competency. Work placement is a requirement of this Certificate as hands-on workplace tasks must be observed and signed off by the assessor trainer.

Course Fee: \$125 per year.

Selection Criteria / Student Requirements:

Suitable clothes for working outdoors in a farm environment, work boots, rubber boots, wet weather attire / broad brimmed hat, sun block, pad / workbook, folder, pen. An embroidered work shirt is provided to students as part of the fee.

Students continuing into the second year of the course will be enrolled under the Training Guarantee for SACE Students (TGSS).
